WHAT:

Wilderness Camp Cost: \$85.00 Offered each week / session

Exiting 4th – 7th graders

During this week you will explore the river for aquatic life, search the woods for edible plants, and learn camp skills and so much more! Let you imagination set the limits for discovery.

Survival Camp Cost: \$85.00 Offered each week / session

Come on an outdoor adventure as you learn the three essentials of survival and how to meet them in Florida's wilderness. Activities may include: plant identification; fire building techniques; methods of finding and conserving water; and construction of primitive shelters. Additional activities may include: tracking, hiking, animal identification, orienteering and archery.

<u>Outdoor Skills Camp</u> Exiting 4th – 7th graders Cost: \$140.00 Offered each week / session

This camp will focus on many skills of the outdoors to include the sport of archery. Students may also participate in hiking, canoeing, setting up a camp, orienteering/GPS and fishing skills. An two off-site field trips are planned: 1) Hillsborough River State Park and 2) a canoe trip down the Hillsborough River (you will launch at Morris Bridge Park & paddle down to Nature's Classroom)

SWFWMD Water Adventure Camp Cost: FREE Offered each week / session Exiting 4th – 7th graders

Come experience Florida's amazing water resources. You will have the opportunity to become a master watershed detective by investigating the fascinating ecosystems within the Hillsborough River Watershed. Campers will seek out wildlife and plant life in their native habitats and learn about their role in the watershed. Participants will also enjoy boating, shoreline sampling and an off-site field trip to Crystal Springs Preserve.
